The first-floor display includes a variety of firearms — shotguns, rifles, pistols, and muzzleloaders that range in price from \$200 to more than \$200,000. Because the Shoppe has multiple models in storage, customers can see in person different firearms they've seen online and compare the virtual with the actual.



For serious collectors, there is also a fine gun room with overstuffed chairs and carved wood details. Display cases feature Bespoke hand etched custom knives, beautiful women's jewelry and accessories, and a modern green safe with a throw-back vibe. Several of the rifles and shotguns standing at attention along the walls are hand carved from Turkish walnut and the metal is hand engraved.

The offerings for shooters at The Preserve don't stop at just the guns themselves. The Preserve also offers extensive lessons and instruction from certified experts at The Preserve's famous range. The Preserve Academy offers gun classes for beginners and experienced shooters. Certified instructors teach classes such as basic pistol, home firearms safety and tactical training.

The range has no caliber restriction, and with 19 bays it has bays as deep at 150 yards – the equivalent of one and a half football fields. That is the longest automated indoor shooting range in North America, according to Mihailides.

In addition to the indoor facility, The Preserve is home to one of the best clay shooting facilities in the country to accommodate this stylish and fast-growing sport which can be enjoyed all year long. An outing to these clay shooting facilities makes for an excellent excursion as a holiday gift.

For Those Who Need Stocking Stuffers:

After all the big gifts are taken care of, there's still great stocking stuffer options for the fans of the outdoors.

<u>Gift Cards are available</u> for those who want the flexibility of picking out their own gear, or even learning a new skill like rifle or pistol shooting.

Upstairs, there's smaller pieces of gear for inshore New England fishing and all freshwater and fly fishing. Other displays feature specialty gifts for the sportsman, like Brackish bow ties creatively made from game bird feathers, fishing lure cufflinks, bullet-shaped "ice cubes" and even gifts for your favorite dog.

At the end of the day, The Shoppe has everything you need no matter what the outdoor occasion is.

The shop is open from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Saturday and until 5 p.m. on Sundays.
